At the Initiative of the Jerusalem Foundation:

Scholarships Totaling 600,000 Shekels Will Be Distributed This Year to 136 Students in Jerusalem

Students of the Arts, Technology and Engineering at Institutions of Higher Education Receiving Jerusalem Foundation Scholarships Will Volunteer for the Community in Their Fields of Study

This year, the Jerusalem Foundation increased its annual allocation for scholarships to students in the city by 60%. Joining the recipients are ultra-Orthodox students at the Haredi College and Students at the Jerusalem College of Technology. Also increased this year is the number of students receiving Jerusalem Foundation scholarships this year at institutions where they were previously distributed, including the Hadassah Academic College, the Bezalel Academy of Art and Design, the Jerusalem Academy of Music and Dance, the Naggar School of Photography, Media and New Music in Musrara and the Azrieli College of Engineering.

In exchange for the scholarships, recipients agree to take active part year round in social and community projects throughout the city. Thus, for example, students at Bezalel create works of art together with special needs children; students at the Sam Spiegel Film and Television School teach cinema classes at junior high schools throughout the city; students at the Academy of Music and Dance provide blind children voice training and musical instruction; students at Bezalel give art workshops at the Paley Center in east Jerusalem.

The annual scholarship distribution ceremony will take place at 6:00 pm on Tuesday, May 21, 2013 in the Gilbert de Botton Auditorium at Mishkenot Sha'ananim.

"The Jerusalem Foundation views investing in students who choose to study in Jerusalem as extremely important", says the Foundation's President, Mark Sofer. "The scholarships help connect the students with the city, encourage them to continue their studies here and leave their mark on the city. This is a key dimension of the Jerusalem Foundation's activities that support young people living and learning in the city."
