DEAR FRIENDS,

I am pleased and excited to share with you our accomplishments of the past year and our vision for the future in the following pages.

Today, the Jerusalem Foundation's mandate is relevant more than ever. The global pandemic, which resulted in a health, social and economic crisis, impacted us all and brought into sharper focus some of the existing issues in Jerusalem. The social fabric of the city and its cultural life have been tested and challenged, and the need for communal strength is all the more pressing. I am proud that we were able to build on the Foundation's half-century of achievement and provide versatile, speedy and appropriate solutions for these times.

2021 was a transition year for the Jerusalem Foundation. A transition from engaging in pandemic-induced activities and giving Jerusalem's most vulnerable denizens immediate basic help, to advancing our Jerusalem 2030 & Beyond Plan, in parallel.

The Foundation's Jerusalem 2030 & Beyond Plan translates into boosting our recent achievements – in the key areas of Communal Strength, Creative Culture and Future Leadership – and continuing this momentum. We will do so by nurturing shared living, reducing gaps between Jerusalem's diverse communities and offering equal opportunities for all.

The past year has demonstrated to us, yet again, renewed faith in the Jerusalem Foundation and in its achievements. 2021 will also prove to be a momentous year for the Jerusalem Foundation whose impact will benefit Jerusalem's residents in the future as well as the Foundation's ability to fulfil its mission. We launched world-class, game-changing educational, community and cultural programmes that will form the basis for our activities in the years to come. And we regained our role as Jerusalem's primary institution: for initiating, leading, coordinating and overseeing projects; for spearheading philanthropic projects; and for productive collaborations with the Jerusalem municipality.

During 2021, the Jerusalem Foundation developed new programs and consolidated exciting opportunities for the future, including:

- Adaptation and update of our Jerusalem 2030 Plan to the new reality;
- Meaningful partnerships with key foundations worldwide that are committed to helping the city of Jerusalem thrive;

- A beneficial, authentic partnership with Jerusalem's mayor and the municipality to advance our programs which includes matching of public funds with philanthropy;
- Planning, initiating and fundraising for programs and projects that will be real game-changers for the city. These include: the first ever community sports center in east Jerusalem; "City as A School"; the Community and Culture Innovation Fund; the Al Mada science and math program; the fund to support creative social ventures by creative young people for young people; CulturEvents (Sidra Tarbut); Kayma leadership fellowship program; and many more.

The past year saw the successful completion of key projects: The Max Rayne Hand in Hand High School for Bilingual Education; a new home for the Train Theater at the Davidson Theatre in Liberty Bell Park; libraries and laboratories for high schools in east Jerusalem; and a renewed auditorium at the Paley Arts Center.

Looking ahead to 2022, we look forward to work on the ground in several exciting, trailblazing projects. These include the construction of east Jerusalem's first community sports center in Beit Hanina as well as the Misgav Lakashish day center for the elderly, the Hassadna Jerusalem Music Conservatory, Beit Hashanti, the Secular Yeshiva and many other prospects which are coming to fruition.

Our successful momentum in launching new programs and developing new directions translates too into an impressive momentum on the financial front. We have increased financial support for our projects and programs in the last three years: 2019 ~ \$19.5M; 2020 ~ \$29.9M; 2021 ~ \$36.9M

This momentum is likely to grow as we expect some \$44M in fundraising during 2022 and it is projected that this increase will continue.

I want to thank all of our friends and supporters around the world, who work unstintingly to prioritize Jerusalem and enable us to keep this city's heart beating strong. It is a huge honor for me to lead the Foundation and partner with you in this worthy enterprise.

If you haven't yet made it back, we can't wait to welcome you back here in Jerusalem. We hope that 2022 will be a year of re-union, re-focusing and re-strengthening as we march forward to 2030 and beyond.

SPOTLIGHT ON:

The Women's Entrepreneurs Incubator

The (Close-to-Home) Women's Entrepreneurs Incubator is a unique social initiative which supports Jerusalemite women who dream of starting their own business. The Incubator – located in the Fanny Kaplan Community Center in Jerusalem's underprivileged Pat neighborhood – gives these women the tools and environment necessary to start and run their business, providing them with professional mentorship, peer support and business opportunities. Around twelve women participate in the incubator program at any given time, and many of them move on to operate a thriving, independent business upon completing the program.

Yaelim

Yaelim is a nature therapy center at the Ein Yael Living Museum, which serves at-risk youth and Jerusalemites with special needs from Jerusalem's diverse communities, in partnership with the Jerusalem Department for Social Services. Yaelim is the only center in Israel which practices this unique method, in three main activity spheres: a day center for at-risk youth suffering from socioeconomic deprivation, domestic abuse, or serious learning and behavioral difficulties; groups for vulnerable populations such as at-risk youth, people contending with mental disorders or special needs, bereaved parents and struggling families; and an after-school program for children from dysfunctional families. Over the course of 2021, over 400 individuals benefited from nature therapy in over 350 sessions.

The Jerusalem Foundation believes that sports can be used as a unique means to minimize gaps between population groups, enable the integration of children with special needs, and bring Arab and Jewish youth together, creating shared living in Jerusalem. Our **'Sports as a means for Shared Living'** projects include:

The UK Shared Living in Jerusalem Fund was established in 2019, and the first projects were chosen from many applicants in 2020. These projects were successfully implemented in 2021, together with support from donors from elsewhere in the world.

- The Madrasa Arabic Initiative trains instructors to teach Arabic to Jews and Hebrew to Arabs
- ‘Shared Courtyards’ brings secular and ultra-Orthodox Jews together in Kiryat HaYovel
- The ‘Shared Community Initiatives Incubator’ is a network of women leaders from East Talpiot and Sur Baher, and an incubator which is developing shared living initiatives between the two neighborhoods

- Language as a Cultural Bridge – teaching Arabic to Hebrew-speakers and Hebrew to Arabic-speakers
- ‘Learning Together in Jerusalem’, the largest program in Israel promoting positive encounters for shared learning between Jewish and Arab youth
- Mini-Active empowerment groups that improve neighborhood infrastructure
- Speaking Hebrew (Lisan), teaching Hebrew to Arab women



JERUSALEM FOUNDATION COMMUNITY AND CULTURE INNOVATION FUND

The Jerusalem Foundation Community and Culture Innovation Fund was established in 2020, in order to ensure Jerusalem's future vitality by encouraging institutions and organizations across the city to create innovative models during and after the pandemic. In 2021, 45 organizations – 20 community organizations and 25 cultural organizations – were given grants ranging from \$10,000 to \$50,000 for their chosen initiatives, and Jerusalem saw innovative projects and events in every corner of the city throughout the year.

Among the highlights from 2021 were:

- A Studio of Her Own – renovation of the studio and garden
- Beit Hanina Community Council – empowering disenfranchised women in east Jerusalem through training in cultural competency, language skills, and basic business practices
- Bezalel & Sha'are Zedek – collaboration between two of Jerusalem's leading art and medical education institutions for creative solutions to community challenges
- Café Europa – free concerts for Holocaust Survivors in partnership with the Jerusalem Music Center
- Establishment of the 'Barmon' and 'Mifletzet' community bar/cafes in East Talpote and Kiryat HaYovel
- 'Hyde Park' Gilo – upgrade of the community center courtyard
- Khan Theater – 'A Wedding in Times of Plague', a site-specific production at Beit Hansen
- 'Light It Up' project by Oman – a first-of-its-kind initiative in the Haredi community, bringing the community together to create a spectacular art installation consisting of over 1,000 lighting fixtures
- Mekudeshet – dissolving boundaries between Palestinian and Israeli cultures through 'Jerusalem in the Cloud', a series of digital art installations by local artists that can be experienced both on-site and virtually
- Muslala – supporting the new Jerusalem Rooftops Festival, a celebration of the greening of urban rooftops across east and west Jerusalem
- New Spirit – adapting a historic site as a new hub for nurturing cultural and creative non-profit NGO's and start-ups
- Paley Arts Center – support for a community theater program to develop acting and theater in east Jerusalem

- Psik Theater – collaborating with the Municipality, the Israel Police, and the Office of the President to train police in Jerusalem, through experiential theater, to support and protect community members with cognitive disabilities

SPOTLIGHT ON 'CULTUREVENTS'

In 2021, we were delighted to partner with the Jack, Joseph & Morton Mandel Foundation to launch 'CulturEvents' (SidraTarbut), a series of cultural events held to support Jerusalem's cultural institutions, Jerusalemite artists and communities in Jerusalem, in their recovery from the Covid pandemic.

Over 50 events – most of which were free of charge or substantially subsidized – were held across the city, in east and west Jerusalem, secular and ultra-Orthodox communities, and neighborhoods spanning the socio-economic spectrum. Thousands of people of all ages attended a diverse range of events, benefiting Jerusalem's communities, and creating widespread impact on the city as a whole.

SPOTLIGHT ON:

SAHI

SAHI (Hesed Youth Patrol) is an organization which impacts the lives of at-risk youth through volunteering and leadership programs. Rather than just helping the youth directly, SAHI empowers them to help themselves by helping those around them. Through volunteering in their local communities, the youth are able to turn their lives around and become the leaders of the future. In 2021, we continued our work supporting SAHI to distribute food packages to needy families. We also supported SAHI in establishing a post-high school service year program for SAHI alumni, which will take their leadership programming to the next level and nurture future leadership in Jerusalem.

'Israel through the Media's Eye' is a new program at the Jerusalem Press Club, in partnership with Qualita and the Jerusalem Municipality, which trains French-speaking immigrants to integrate into Israel's media sector. In 2021, we initiated and supported the program, including a number of seminars and panel events which allow these immigrants to pick up the tools needed to make their careers in Israeli media, including networking and specialized training.

Kayma

Kayma – the George Pinto Jerusalem Leadership Fellows Program – is a leadership program for PhD students, which is creating a cadre of quality young leadership in Jerusalem. Kayma had its second full year in 2021, with a second cohort of fellows beginning the program, and the first cohort of five fellows continuing their work with some of the city's leading civil society organizations.



Achievements 2021

- Renovation of the Irene & Fred Lewy Youth Club
- Establishment of a program for youth leaders in disadvantaged neighborhoods, in partnership with Tene Yerushalmi and the Israel Scouts youth movement
- SAHI Hesed Youth Patrol – establishment of a post-high school year program for alumni of SAHI, to develop leadership and community service for youth from at-risk groups



Activities & Programs 2021

- Goldstein Prize for Good Citizenship – awarded to chapters of the Israeli Scouts (Tzofim) and Bnei Akiva
- Kayma – the George Pinto Jerusalem Leadership Fellows Program, for PhD students who work at civil society organizations and participate in leadership seminars
- Jerusalem Institute for Policy Research – two-year evaluation on future leadership
- SAHI Hesed Youth Patrol – at-risk youth volunteering, distributing food packages to needy families

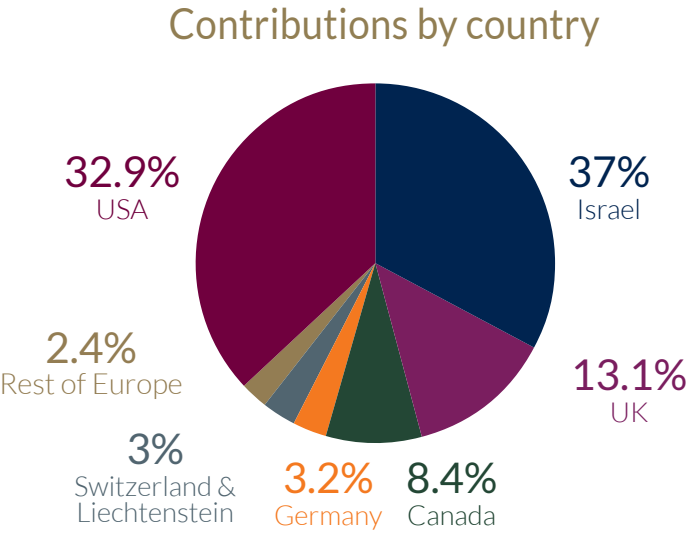

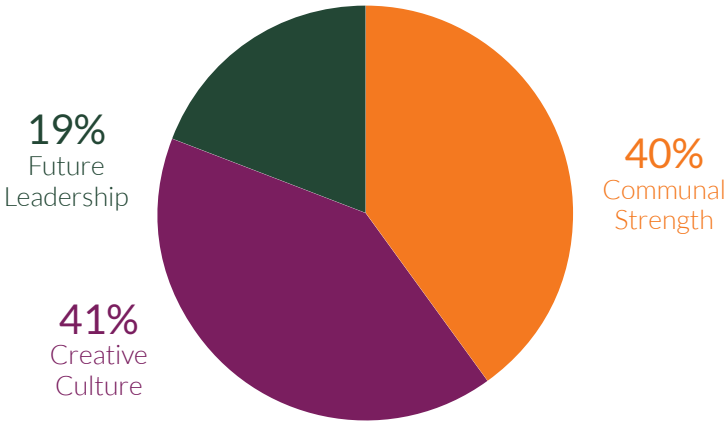

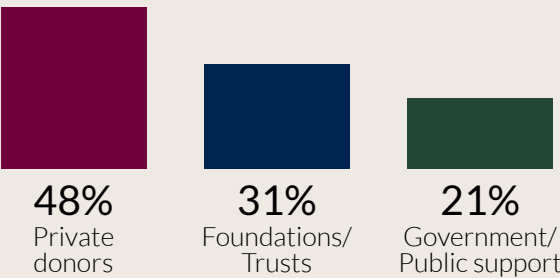


Allocations to Projects:

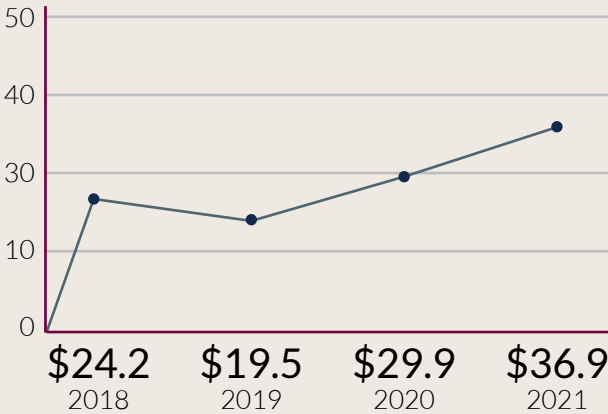
Programming expenditure by category



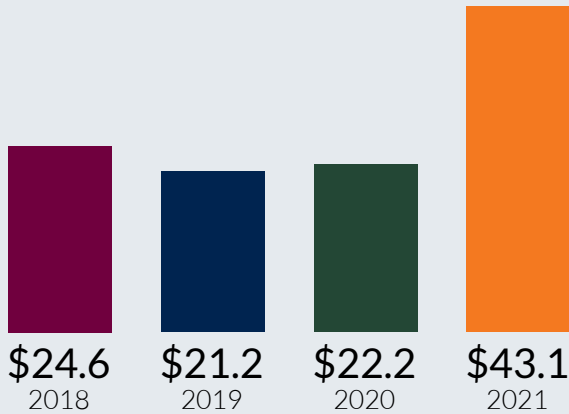
Contributions by type of donor



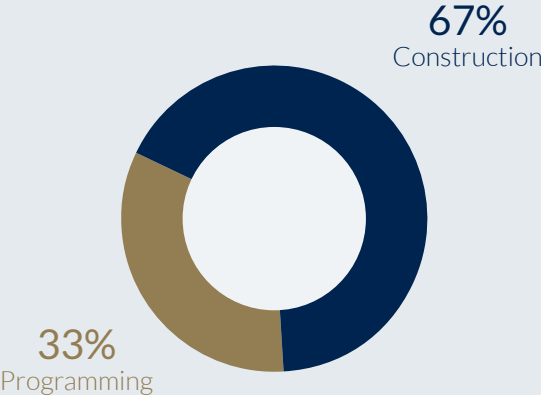
Donations 2018-2021
