


The High School Building of the Max Rayne Hand in Hand School for Bilingual Education

The Max Rayne Hand in Hand Bilingual School in Jerusalem is the largest Hand in Hand school in Israel and the only one that extends from pre-kindergarten to 12th grade. It is the only high school in the world where Jews and Arabs learn together in a bilingual (Hebrew and Arabic) environment for a high school diploma.

New High School Building

After sharing cramped quarters with the elementary school for the last 10 years, the growing high school will finally have its own space.

The design includes unique features that cater to the bilingual and multicultural nature of the school. The 2,490 m² (26,800 ft²) space was designed according to Israel's latest green, sustainable construction and accessibility standards.

It includes a new entrance to the campus, a three-storey building and active roof terrace, a science wing, laboratories and display area and an auditorium that will serve the high school, the elementary school and other community functions.

The active roof features an environmental studies classroom, cafeteria and garden, where the students can relax and enjoy a breathtaking view of Jerusalem.

The dream of having a beautiful, fitting building with world-class facilities for the Hand in Hand High School is now a reality, and we are very grateful to all those who have made this possible.

Having grown up in a multicultural, integrated school framework, alumni are fluent in both Arabic and Hebrew, maintain strong social ties, have a deep understanding of each other's perspectives and are active and engaged citizens and ambassadors of inclusiveness, equal opportunities and mutual understanding.

Alumni have gone on to study at prestigious universities in Israel and across the world, pursuing varied professions including law, environmentalism, psychology, medicine, philosophy, the arts and non-profit management.
