Dear Friends,

This past year has been tumultuous for Jerusalem, for Israel, for the Jewish people and for the Jerusalem Foundation. We continued to deal with the challenges of the continuing war in our region and we lost our beloved President and leader, Shai Doron z"l.



I became President on January 1, 2025, 5 months after the loss of Shai. The Jerusalem Foundation found a way forward in spite of the personal and professional loss to our team and to our city. I believe that we can be proud of how we coped and how we have continued to support the people of Jerusalem, and all of the evacuees who found refuge in our city. We have continued to rebuild trust between the diverse populations of Jerusalem, we have found ways to bring art and culture to all corners of the city and we have supported young leaders and civil society as we weather the storm around us.

The Foundation raised a total of \$66,858,444 for projects and programs in Jerusalem in 2024. This is our greatest achievement to date, and I believe it is just the beginning.

Under the leadership of Shai Doron z"l, the Jerusalem Foundation achieved new heights and when crisis came to our country and our city, the Foundation was able to take a lead role in responding to the most immediate needs. Thanks to our ongoing and important partnership with Mayor Moshe Lion and the Jerusalem Municipality, we are able to leverage all of the networks of the city and to make sure that resources and collaborations make the most of our philanthropic support.

I wish to express my gratitude to the Jerusalem Foundation leadership and staff, and our professional teams around the world, who have contributed to this significant growth in fundraising. And to our professional team on the ground, led by Jerusalem Foundation General Director, Imry Ben Ami, and the entire management team, who took the helm of the Foundation

after the untimely and shocking loss of Shai Doron, and kept us going in the right direction and even expanded our work and our partnerships to continue Shai's legacy and vision. We will continue to support the people of Jerusalem and the resilience and strength of the city.

Next year, in 2026, we will celebrate the 60th Anniversary of the founding of the Jerusalem Foundation and we look forward to gathering friends from around the world in Jerusalem to mark this special occasion.

We hope that better days are ahead and I look forward to welcoming all visitors and friends to Jerusalem.

Shai Doron in Memoriam

Shai was a devoted servant of Jerusalem—the city where he was born, raised, and lived his entire life. He believed in a shared city where diversity is strength and all communities have the opportunity to thrive. He understood that strong leadership was essential to securing Jerusalem’s future and ensuring prosperity for all its residents.

More than just a visionary, Shai led by example. From his early days in the Israeli Scouts to leading the Neve Ya’akov Community Center before the age of 30 and later serving as chief of staff to Mayor Teddy Kollek, his dedication to the city never wavered. Under his leadership, the Tisch Family Zoological Gardens flourished, achieving remarkable success. He later brought the same passion and drive to the Jerusalem Foundation, leading it to its most significant fundraising achievements in nearly 60 years.

During Shai’s tenure as president of the Jerusalem Foundation, we developed the 3-pillar “Jerusalem 2030” plan, with a focus on Future Leadership as a means to ensure that the city continues to be a beacon of civil society. Shai believed with all his heart that promoting young civil leadership is key to advancing communities and society.

The Jerusalem Foundation seeks to honor Shai’s legacy by reimagining Mishkenot Sha’ananim and including The Shai Doron Center for Leadership & the Humanities, a place for training and enriching future leaders who will transform the face of modern Jerusalem, alongside continued thought provoking, meaningful cultural and intellectual programming.

Ein Yael - Yaelim

Ein Yael Archaeological Garden for Crafts, Culture and Nature has become a unique hub for healing and resilience. In 2005, it launched the Ya'elim program, pioneering Nature Therapy in Israel and providing support for marginalized youth and trauma survivors. Following the outbreak of war, the center expanded its services. Officially recognized in March 2024 by the Israeli Ministry of Defense and National Insurance Institute, it now serves as a vital trauma rehabilitative center, accepting referrals from these institutions.

Hamiffal – Language exchange

HaMiffal (“The Factory”) is a vibrant cultural and arts center that serves as a vital platform for cross-sector dialogue and idea exchange. As part of this mission, HaMiffal runs a Hebrew-Arabic Language Exchange Program, led by a Hebrew-speaking and an Arabic-speaking teacher. The program fosters meaningful connections between people of different backgrounds through mutual language learning, following the core belief that language is more than just a tool for communication—it is a bridge to partnership and friendship.

Creative Culture

Bekhorot: Students' Premier Festival, December 25-26

This year marked the launch of Bekhorot (Premiers), a groundbreaking Jerusalem art festival conceived as a platform for art students to premiere their work and gain exposure. Initiated by The Jerusalem Foundation in collaboration with the Jerusalem Municipality and supported by the Jack, Joseph & Morton Mandel Foundation, the two-day event was the first of its kind in Jerusalem and Israel. Held at the Jerusalem Art Campus and Bezalel Academy of Art & Design's new city center locations, Bekhorot offered art students and recent graduates a unique opportunity to showcase their creativity and talent.

Future Leadership

Leadership Seminar in Jerusalem, May 2024

It was not possible to take anything for granted since Oct. 7th, least of which that we would be able to welcome over 70 friends and board members from around the world to Jerusalem in May to participate in the Future Leadership Seminar.

They had the opportunity to meet young partners and collaborators in the field who are making a difference in the lives of all Jerusalemites. The network of young leaders that was built over many years proved itself during this time of challenge and strife. These leaders of Jerusalem civil society are part of our effort to create a strong community and an open and pluralistic shared society in the city. They are also our great hope for the future and certainly for the "day after".



Future Leadership Programs

- **The Jerusalem Scholarship Fund:** Distributed over 2,000 scholarships to higher education students who volunteered, each giving 140 hours of their time to a variety of non-profit organizations and civil society institutions. The aim of these scholarships is to assist students, encourage them to study at Jerusalem's higher education institutions and connect them with Jerusalem and its residents.



- **The Social Impact Fund (Keren Lee):** Established by Israeli donors to support young Jerusalemites with non-profit startup Jerusalem projects or the expansion of existing sustainable initiatives, funded the following 8 projects in 2024: Achva BaKerem; The Fanny Kaplan Community Center Food Truck; Jerusalem Theater Incubator; Teva Ivri Warehouse for Entrepreneurs; HaMiffal's Friday Students' Arts Fair; The Lev Jerusalem Basketball Club – Female Coach Training Program; Urban Deco; Barmon community café-bar.
- **George Pinto Jerusalem Leadership (Kayma) Program:** The Jerusalem Foundation's distinguished doctorate fellows' program completed four years of activities and opened the 5th cohort.
- **Jerusalemites for Jerusalem Program:** A gap year program for young Jerusalem residents encouraging them to stay in Jerusalem after their military service by placing them in positions volunteering and becoming part of Jerusalem's civil society.
- **East Jerusalem Social Workers program:** Creating the next generation of social workers in East Jerusalem by providing tuition and a special incubator for each cohort to succeed and to find employment following graduation.
- **Impact Israel Scouts:** Providing special leadership training for in-depth community work and cooperation with the local community center for the youth movement's branches in peripheral areas, transforming the branches into strong community forces in the neighborhoods.
- **Beit Midrash Ilan:** Ultra-Orthodox program for young leadership, aiming to empower voices within the Haredi society who grant full religious legitimacy for joining the workforce, teaching core curricula and obtaining academic degrees.
- **SAHI Gap Year Program:** In partnership with SAHI, a pioneering community service gap year program for vulnerable youth in Jerusalem, in its second year with 10 participants.
- **East Jerusalem Gap Year Program:** In partnership with JVP – Bekehila, a unique gap-year program for young adults (ages 18–21) from East Jerusalem, aimed at instilling valuable life skills, and cultivate young leadership.

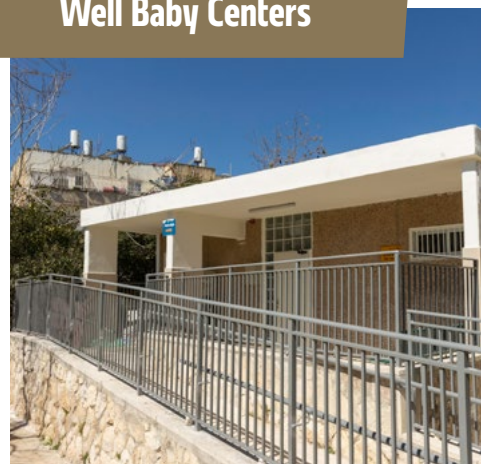

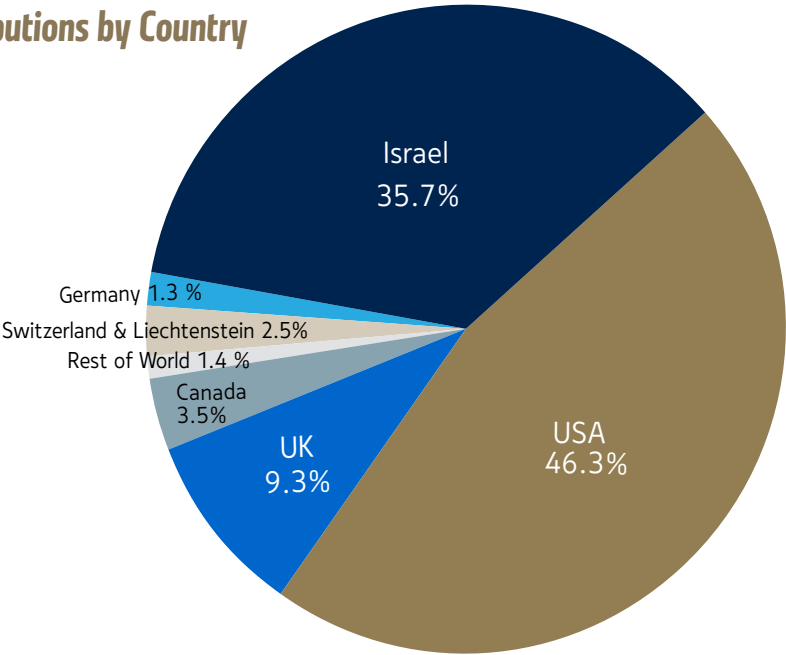

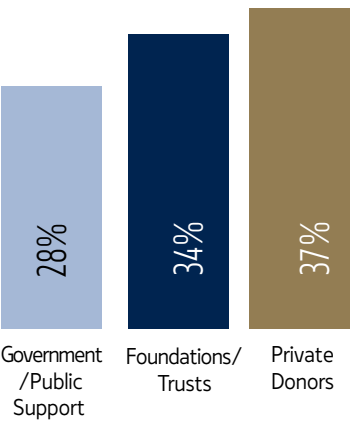

Contributions by Country

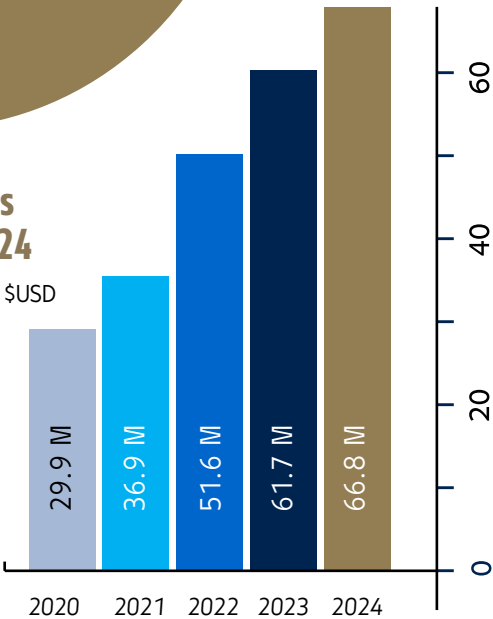


Contribution by Type of Donor



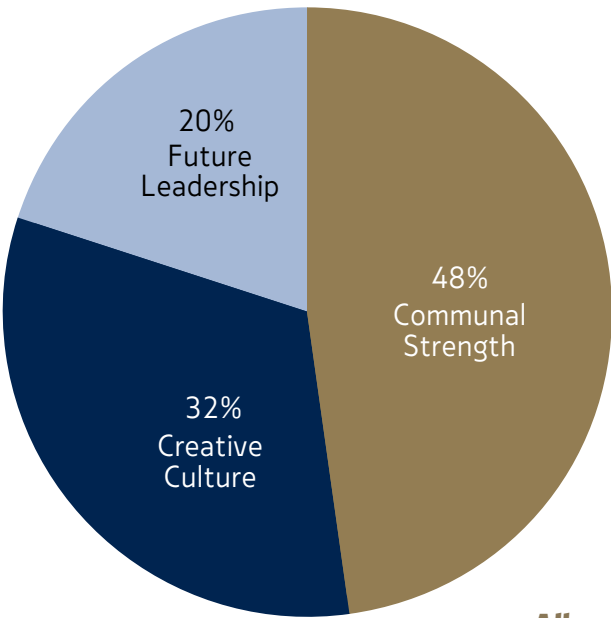

in millions of \$USD

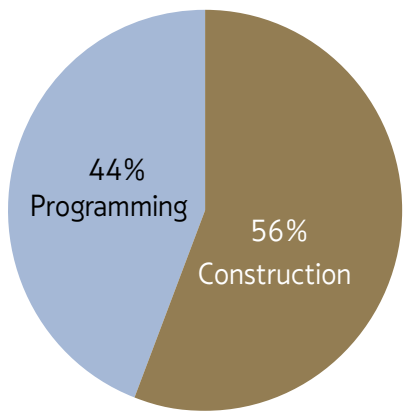


EXPENDITURES **Allocations to Projects: \$43,916,147**

Programming Expenditure by Category

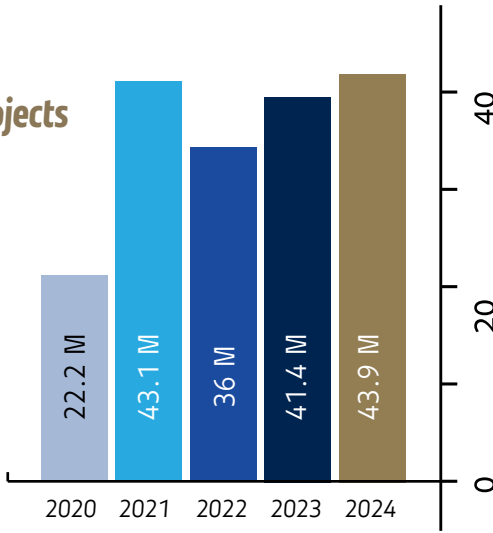


Expenditure by Type of Project
