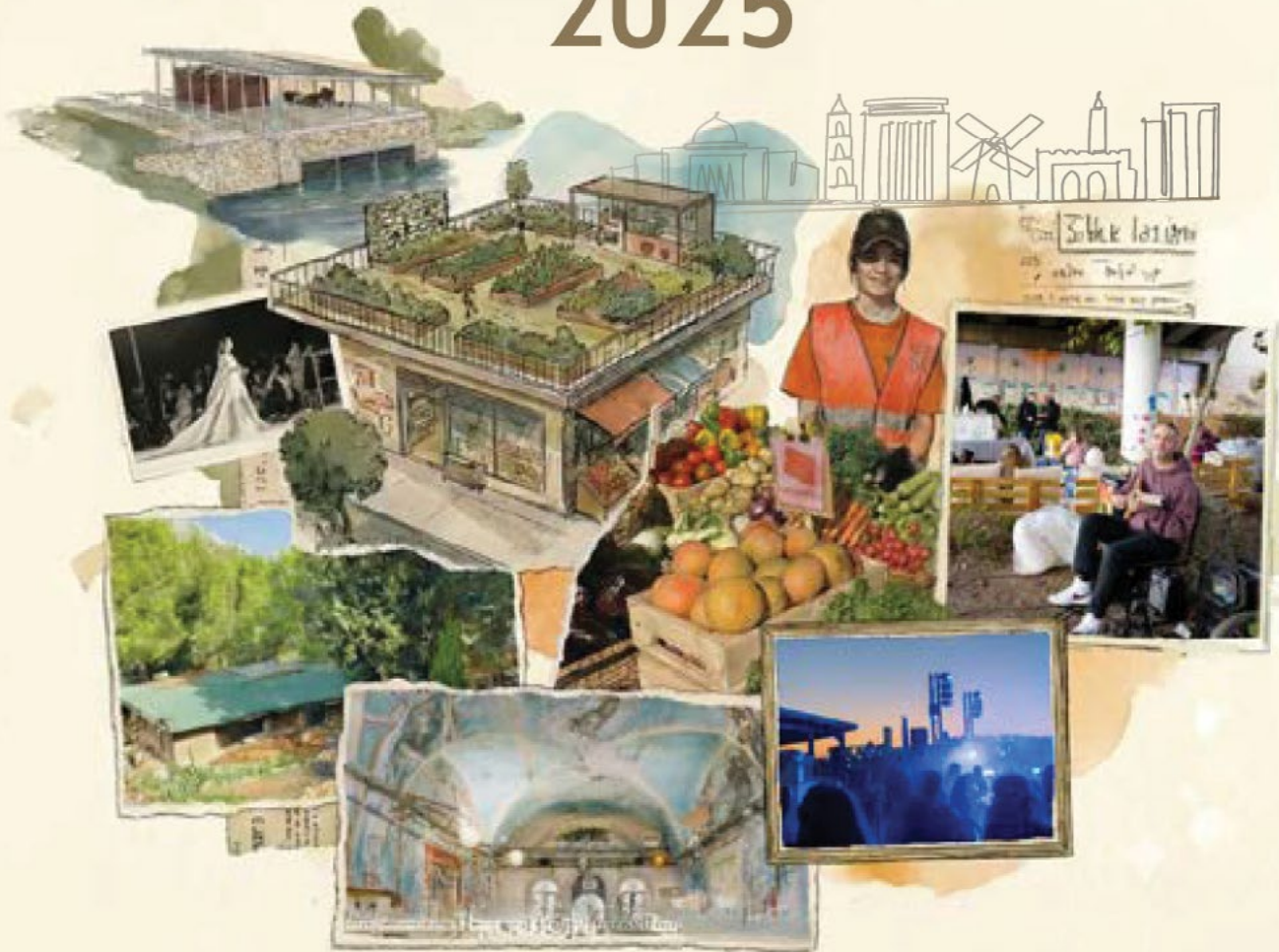

It has been a year of great challenges but also of great hope. I am profoundly grateful for the opportunity I was given on January 1st, 2025, and I have been overwhelmed and deeply moved by the support from friends around the world for the mission of the Jerusalem Foundation and for our efforts. And to our professional team on the ground, led by Jerusalem Foundation General Director, Imry Ben Ami, and the entire management team. In face of acute need for professional support of those affected emotionally and mentally under the extended war, the program focused on boosting wellbeing among groups not recognized by official agencies. The Jerusalem Foundation partnership enabled activities of 4 distinct support groups of family members of people dealing with PTSD throughout 2025: Parents' Group, Partners' Group, Children's Group and Siblings' Group

Shared Society 2025

'AHALAN' – Spoken Arabic Studies Program in Jewish Schools

Original multiple year program bringing select Arabic speaking higher education teaching-students to Hebrew speaking junior high schools for weekly spoken Arabic classes. Despite the extended war and tense atmosphere, the program expanded to include 26 schools and 1,500 pupils in 2025.

'AHALAN' ('hello' in Arabic) fosters unmediated, personal connections between Jewish schoolchildren, the Arabic language and a native Arabic speaker, reducing alienation and fear of the 'other'.

Kulna – Bringing People Together

Grassroots initiative fostering shared living through culture events, sports, neighborhood forums and civil leadership. Kulna managed dozens of programs in 2025, engaging over 15,000 participants from the city's different communities. The Jerusalem Foundation supported "Train Track Coffee" – a community initiative fostering encounters around coffee and cake in the Train Track Park, a bilingual art event at the Liberty Bell Park and Jewish-Arab higher education student exchange.

Arts and Culture 2025

Sidra Tarbut (CulturEvents) – Forty Days of Art and Culture throughout Jerusalem

2025 was the third consecutive year of this outstanding series led by the Jerusalem Foundation with the support of the Jack, Joseph & Morton Mandel Foundation. Events by local Jerusalem artists, hosted by Jerusalem art & culture institutions and attended by diverse communities from all across the city. Extensive dispersion of events throughout the city's neighborhoods, bringing the spark of culture outside of the city center. Over 100 events by 160 artists, drawing 15,000 participants, featuring an eclectic mix of programs, ranging from concerts in community centers to fringe music festivals and contemporary plastic and visual arts productions, boosting the city's cultural ecosystem. Included events for the general public and culturally adapted events for the ultra-Orthodox sector and in East Jerusalem.

"This opportunity to create original work that incorporates local organizations, spaces and artists, and provides the public with moments of inspiration and a chance to catch their breath amid the madness of wartime, is invaluable. Bechorot (First Born/Premiers) Jerusalem Art Students Festival

Jerusalem's (and Israel's) first-of-a-kind student festival, taking the stage for the 2nd time in 2025. Over 4,000 students' study in Jerusalem art colleges and close to 400 fresh graduates enter the workforce each year. The festival connected art-higher-education institutions with Jerusalem's city center and introduced the public to those institutions and the future generation of Jerusalem artists. It included some 300 student creatives from 10 higher-education institutions, drawing 5,000 visitors. Initiated and led by the Jerusalem Foundation in cooperation with the Jerusalem Municipality, with the support of the Jack, Joseph & Morton Mandel Foundation.

Future Leadership 2025

Shai Doron Leadership Fellows Program

Nurturing young dynamic civil society leaders is one of the central pillars of the Jerusalem Foundation. The trailblazing Shai Doron Leadership Fellows Program was launched in mid-2025 as an impactful network championing shared society, diversity and the city's distinct human tapestry in order to empower and be representative of each of the city's communities. In the aftermath of the attacks of October 7th, 2023, we have witnessed how the leadership and initiatives of civil society, particularly young leaders, made all the difference in responding to the city's immediate needs under the crisis. The program was established in memory of former Jerusalem Foundation president, Shai Doron z"l, a visionary leader who saw opportunities when others could see only obstacles. As an avid believer in equal opportunities for all, and in the power of young leadership to impact communities, Shai envisioned this inspirational initiative for continued advancement of future leadership in Jerusalem. The first Cohort was launched in 2025 with 11 Fellows.

SAHI House

SAHI House opened in the Kiryat Yovel neighborhood in April 2025. The project transformed an old building into a renewed space, designed to meet the organization's needs, with spaces for social and volunteer activity, residential quarters for gap year of service volunteers, offices and an outdoor yard.

The center serves as a community hub for youth engaged in values based social action, reflecting the Jerusalem Foundation's commitment to strengthening civil society in Jerusalem and building leadership. The Jerusalem Foundation created a fully renovated and welcoming facility that serves as SAHI's first permanent home and activity center in the city.

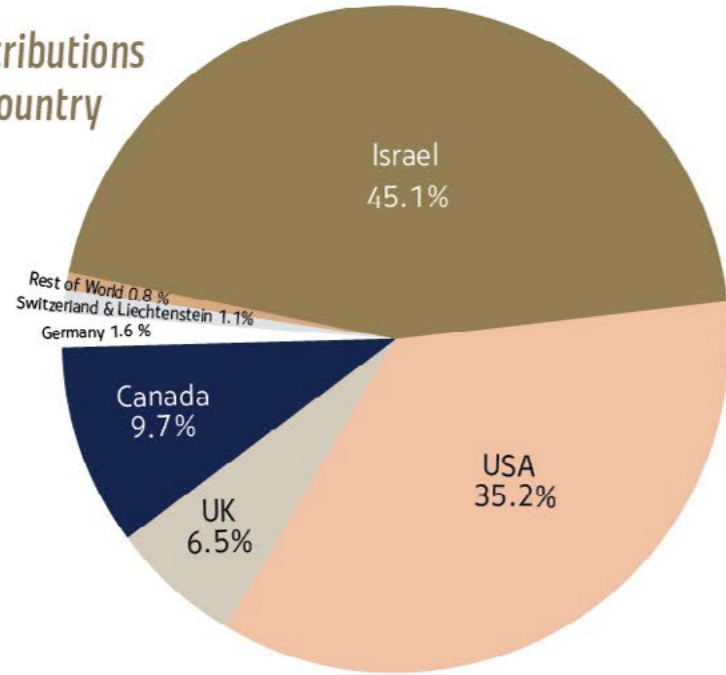

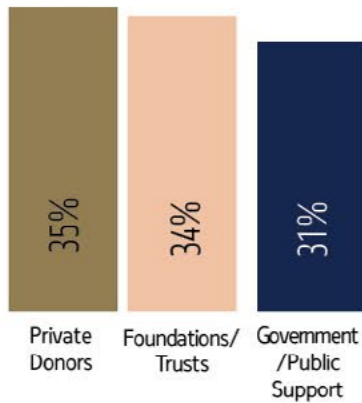

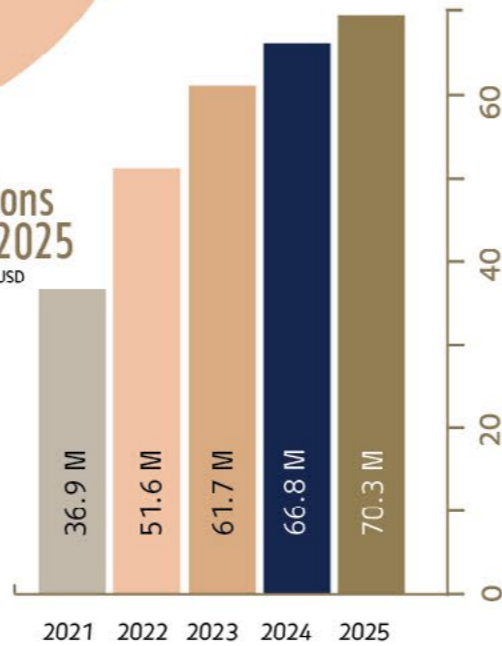
Contributions by Country



Contribution by Type of Donor

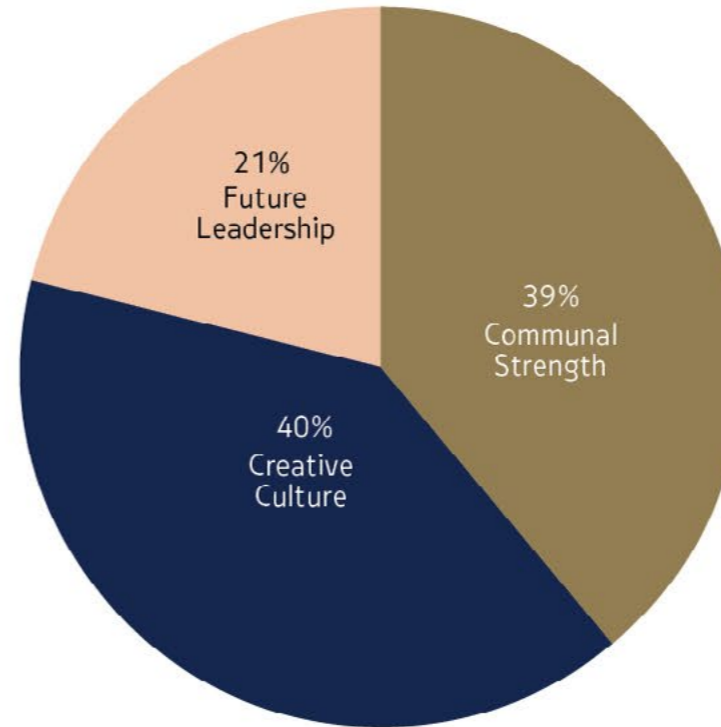


Donations 2021-2025
in millions of \$USD

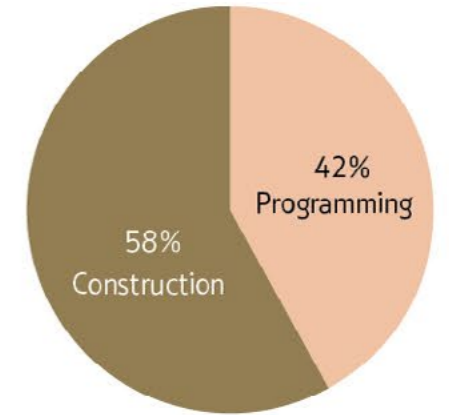


EXPENDITURES Allocations to Projects: \$55,483,879

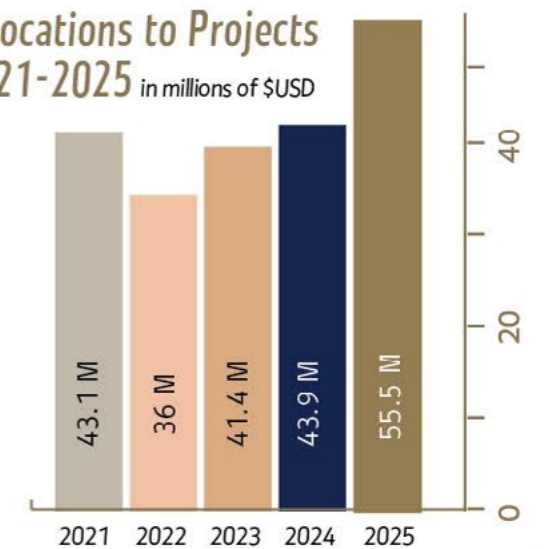
Programming Expenditure by Category

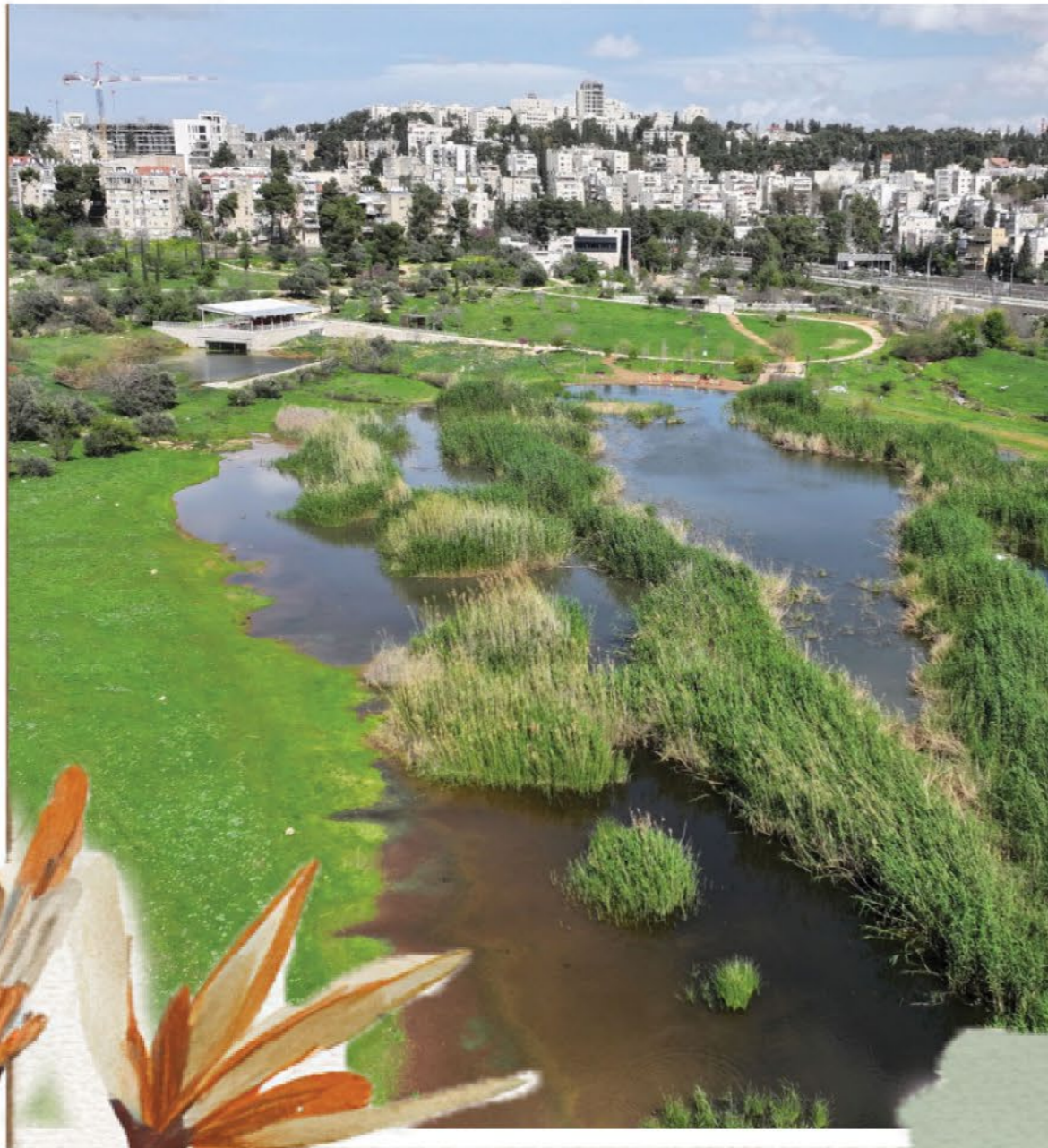
